
Chance 2 Advance provides mega learning in Limpopo



Since the inception of the Chance 2 Advance programme in 2011 the programme has worked diligently to ensure that communities across South Africa are enriched through access to relevant and user friendly knowledge. To date the programme has implemented more than 70 learning initiatives, held over 600 workshops, extended to more than 150 communities in 6 provinces and reached over 75 000 participants. This is a snapshot of the reach of Chance 2 Advance since 2011.

The Chance 2 Advance programme recently held its annual mega learning and empowerment programme in Dennilton, Limpopo. The programme offered 67 workshops across 12 venues and recorded an attendance of just over 8 000 participants.

According to project leader Dr Genevieve James, Chance 2 Advance has adopted an informal learning approach, ensuring that distressed communities across the country benefit from cutting edge teaching and research produced primarily by Unisa academics and support staff.

"Knowledge is mobilized, contextualised and shared with communities to facilitate mutually beneficial learning, increased employability, social justice consciousness and active citizenship," she said.
