Selected fellows will work with faculty research directors Loren Landau (Political Science and Sociology, University of Witwatersrand, Johannesburg) and Stephen Lubkemann (Anthropology and International Affairs, George Washington University) to enhance their dissertation research plans within this area of study through participation in two workshops:

- \* The Spring Workshop will be held May 19-24, 2013 in Washington, DC
- \* The Fall Workshop will be held September 25-29, 2013 on the campus of the University of the Witwatersrand in Johannesburg, South Africa.

#### STUDENT SUPPORT

Fellows attend workshops in the spring and fall of the fellowship cycle, which provide a framework for dissertation research and guide dissertation research plans. In the summer months between workshops, DPDF fellows carry out exploratory field research on their topics to evaluate issues of feasibility and methods of investigation. The DPDF program covers necessary costs for workshop participation and up to \$5,000 for summer research. Fellows' attendance at both workshops is mandatory.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

The "Mobility, Empowerment and Precarity in African Migration" research field is open to 1st year doctoral students at universities within the following countries: Botswana, Kenya, Namibia, South Africa, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia, and Zimbabwe.

document and certified academic transcripts, medical certificate indicating disability.

• Should you not follow the guidelines for attaching the necessary documents your application

will not be considered.

• Complete applications will go to the host university, for verification before being forwarded to

the NRF for further processing.

Incomplete applications will not be considered.

• Applications that do not meet the eligibility criteria will not be considered (please refer to call

document for details on eligibility for the NRF Disability Masters and Doctoral programme )
