All sessions will be offered online, on Tuesdays from 17:00 to 19:00, and the content will also be accessible via recordings for asynchronous engagement.

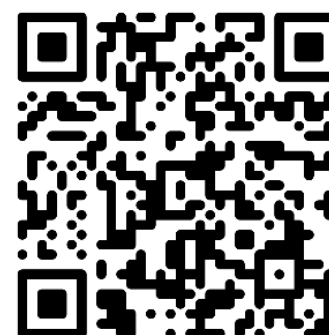
