Marinkie has presented and published papers locally and internally on Mobile Learning, Elearning and Women empowerment.

Her expertise in Elearning is also one of her strong points, she has designed the Unisa Online ethics course which was launched in Geneva in 2015. The course is currently offered internationally by Unisa in collaboration with ethics SA and an international company Globe ethics – giving her an international footprint.

As part of community engagement she is visible among the little-humans in the Africa Crèche Project in empowering women as ECD practitioners. Marinkie is also the chairperson of the Unisa women Forum since 2016 where she has grown the membership of UNISA women forum from 300 to 550. Marinkie is always there to care for women big and small. An ever-present mother and sister.

Marinkie is also one of the ministerial appointees to the Council of the Vuselela TVET College. As a council member she serves and support TVETs colleges in transforming their curriculum and also supporting TVETs to align their programs to the needs of the South African society.

Marinkie also represented South Africa in 2016 on ELearning as a Ministerial appointee: delegation to Taiwan for E-Learning and Bilateral agreement. Dr Marinkie Madiope is also one of the Elearning experts appointed by the African Union to develop an Elearning strategy for the new Open Distance and ELearning University of Africa.

Marinkie is also one one of the experts representing South Africa for the proposed African Virtual and E-University. The African University is one of AU's flagship projects that has been proposed for addressing the Agenda 2063 need for accelerating development of human capital, science and technology and innovation through increasing access to tertiary and continuing education in Africa by capitalizing on the digital revolution and global knowledge; reaching large numbers of students and professionals in multiple sites simultaneously-anywhere, anytime; and by consolidating African initiatives and strategies on accelerated development of human capital; science, technology and innovation
