PROCEDURE DURING THE CEREMONY

GRADUANDS

- AFTER THE CHANCELLOR'S ADDRESS, THE GRADUAND WHOSE NAME IS LISTED FIRST IN THE PROGRAMME WILL BE REQUESTED TO RISE, AND WHILST CARRYING THE HOOD OVER THE LEFT ARM AND SEATING CARD IN THE RIGHT HAND, ASCENDS THE STAGE FROM THE RIGHT (AS SEEN FROM THE AUDIENCE).
- THE GRADUAND HANDS HIS OR HER CARD TO THE DEAN, WHO READS OUT THE NAME.

AFTER THE NAME HAS BEEN READ OUT, THE CARD IS RETURNED TO THE GRADUAND. THE GRADUAND THEN WALKS TOWARDS THE CHANCELLOR AND KNEELS (WITH THE RIGHT KNEE UPON THE STOOL) WHILE THE CHANCELLOR CONFERS THE DEGREE.

- THE GRADUATE APPROACHES THE REGISTRAR, WHO WILL BE STANDING AT THE CHANCELLOR'S RIGHT (I.E. TO THE LEFT AS SEEN FROM THE AUDIENCE), HANDS OVER THE HOOD, AND TURNS TO FACE THE AUDIENCE. A PHOTOGRAPH IS TAKEN WHEN THE REGISTRAR DRAPES THE HOOD.
- THE GRADUATE DESCENDS THE STAGE AT THE AUDIENCE'S LEFT.
- THE GRADUATE RETURNS TO HIS OR HER SEAT.

DIPLOMA CANDIDATES

- THE CANDIDATE WHOSE NAME IS LISTED FIRST IN THE PROGRAMME WILL BE REQUESTED TO RISE, AND HOLDING THE SEATING CARD IN THE RIGHT HAND, ASCENDS THE STAGE FROM THE RIGHT (AS SEEN FROM THE AUDIENCE). SINCE THE NECKBAND WILL NOT BE DRAPED ON STAGE, THE CANDIDATE MUST WEAR THE NECKBAND WHEN ASCENDING THE STAGE.
- THE CANDIDATE HANDS HIS OR HER CARD TO THE RELEVANT COLLEGE REPRESENTATIVE WHO READS OUT THE NAME.
- AFTER THE NAME HAS BEEN READ OUT, THE CANDIDATE WALKS ACROSS THE STAGE AND SHAKES HANDS WITH THE REGISTRAR. A PHOTOGRAPH WILL BE TAKEN AT THIS MOMENT.


