The President's speech marks the opening of the parliamentary programme and is attended by important political and governmental figures in South Africa, including former Presidents, the Chief Justice of the Republic and other members of the judiciary, the Governor of the Reserve bank, Ambassadors and Diplomats to the Republic, amongst others.
