

MEDIA ADVISORY Unisa collaborate with The Vehicle Crime Academy to offer Basic Vehicle Identification Training to some member of SAPS

According to Tracker, a vehicle tracking company, "A staggering R8. 5 billion worth of vehicles are stolen and hijacked in SA annually. The majority of these, almost 30%, are taken across the border to neighbouring countries where syndicates are making huge profits". To bring a solution to this ever-growing social challenge, The University of South Africa (Unisa) in collaboration with the Vehicle Crime Academy will be facilitating a one-day training for South African Police Services (SAPS) and Metro Police Officers on the 31st of August 2022 at the South African Insurance Crime Bureau (SAICB) at Waterfall Office Park (Midrand).

The Vehicle Crime Academy has committed to offering training opportunities to twenty (20) South African Police Service officers, and Metro Police officers respectively to fight against vehicle-associated crimes. The training offered is accredited by the Safety and Security Sector Education and Training Authority (SASSETA).
