Unisa to host the 2025 Chancellor's Shaping Futures Golf Challenge to raise funds for student bursaries.

The University of South Africa (Unisa) will host the **2025 Unisa Chancellor's Shaping Futures Golf Challenge** on Friday, 10 October 2025 at the Randpark Club, in Johannesburg.

The golf day has been held annually in collaboration with the Unisa Gauteng Region with the aim to raise funds for student bursaries and to benefit students to be able to graduate and contribute meaningfully to the society.

At present, over 27 000 students are in need of funding to graduate and/or progress to the next level of their studies. These are the students who have completed their undergraduate qualifications, excluding higher certificates, but are unable to graduate while others are left with five modules or less before they can exit the Unisa system and fulfil their study dreams.

This year alone, the University and its donor partners have funded over 5 156 students. This is a significant investment in the education of our students and the young in society.

An estimated 120 players will participate in this year's golf challenge, amongst them donors, alumni, stakeholders, Chancellor's Club members, Management of Unisa and executives from private and public companies.

The tournament will also offer networking opportunities for golfers and potential sponsors to interact with the Executive Management of Unisa to have more knowledge about the university's student support as well as critical areas that require partnerships, collaborations and investments.
