## Place names

In South Africa, two kinds of place names may be distinguished: traditional African place names and English or Afrikaans place names. Most of the bigger towns and cities have English or Afrikaans names; however, these places are also given names by the Zulu people. For example, Johannesburg is known as *eGoli* in Zulu; Cape Town as *eKapa*; Port Elizabeth as *eBhayi*; Pietermaritzburg as *eMgungundlovu*; Durban as *eThekwini* and so on.

As you would have noticed, in Zulu we mostly use the prefix *e*- in front of a place name to indicate location, e.g. *ikhaya* (home) > *ekhaya* (at home), *ibhange* (bank) > *ebhange* (at the bank), *eGemistoni* (at / to Germiston), *eCeasars Palace* (at / to Ceasars Palace, *eKempton Park* (at / to Kempton Park). However, *kwacan also be used as prefix*, e.g. *Ngiya kwaZulu Natal* (l'm going to kwaZulu Natal). Sometimes a prefix and suffix can be used to indicate location, e.g. Siya *eposini* namhlanje (We go to the post office today), Ngiya

emdlalweni (I'm going to the game).
