3. Why is it important to improve vocabulary

- It is used to write assignments, researches, analyse literature and understand disciplinespecific vocabulary
- It increases the perception that you are wellinformes

The demands of improving academic vocabulary

- Get into an appropriate learning state of mind.
- Use your senses to acquire informationvision, hearing, touching, smell, and feeling
- Work consistently, when learning new words
- Understand what you are learning
- Memorise what you are learning

4. Kinds of words that must be learnt

- The most common words in English which occur frequently in all texts
- The specialist vocabulary of your course such as Law terms
- Common academic vocabulary

5. Ways to improve vocabulary

5.1 Read extensively

Reading exposes one to new words

- Literary works such as novels, magazines and newspapers.
- Academic essays, reports and excerpts from prescribed books
- Attempt to derive meaning from the context of the sentence.
- Look up the definitions in a dictionary (online).

Ways to improve

- 5.1 Read extensively
- Underline or highlight words in a text
- Use pictures or diagrams in the text to help you understand the words

5.2 Learn new vocabulary daily

- Learn discipline specific terms, concepts that have explicit meaning that is critical to understanding content
- Learn how to pronounce the new words
- Check how they are spelt
- Find out what role it plays in a sentence

5.3 Learn a new word

- Find out which other words can be used with that word
- Use new vocabulary when engaging with other students
- Record new vocabulary and listen to it
- Ask someone to explain a new word to you

5.4 Keep a dictionary or a thesaurus

- Use any version you prefer- print, software or online
- When uncovering a new word, work out its meaning for yourself then look it up in the dictionary, get both the pronunciation and its meanings, whether they are formal or informal
- Use a thesaurus and find similar words and phrases
- Look for opposites and antonyms respectively and learn how to use those words in different contexts
- Specialised dictionaries such as the Dictionary of science which defines specialist terms

5.4.1 Locating a dictionary

- Print dictionaries which can be purchased online or from a bookstore. They normally provide a CD containing additional resources such as an advice on how to learn vocabulary exercises, pronounciation
- Dictionary application that can be accessed through the smartphone or tablet
- Free online dictionaries

6. Keep a journal

- Compile a list of new words you discover and refer back to them .
- Use them everyday
- This can provide a positive reinforcement for learning new words
- Write sentences or paragraphs using new words

7. Learn the root words

- Using root words is a powerful tool to learn new words
- This enables the deciphering of new words
- Most of English words come from Latin or Greek except for political and mathematical words
- Learn where a word comes from and how it found its way into the English language
- Common root words form the basis of new words through the addition of prefixes and suffixes.

- Engage in discussions (forums on myUnisa)
