

Sophie Mokoena, born in Frankfurt in the Free State, rose from student leadership during South Africa's transition to democracy, where she championed voter education, tolerance, and empowerment initiatives, to become one of the country's most prominent journalists. After serving as an IEC monitor in the Vaal during the 1994 elections, she joined SABC, where she broke barriers as the first black female Parliament Reporter and later as the first female International News Editor. From anchoring popular radio shows and growing audiences to covering politics, international affairs, and the life of Nelson Mandela, Mokoena built a career marked by integrity, global insight, and trailblazing achievements that amplified South Africa's voice in both national and international spaces.

He is widely recognised for his commentary on the country's political landscape, particularly around elections, party dynamics, governance, and social issues such as unemployment and nation-building. Teffo is known for his balanced insights, often calling for pragmatic solutions such as coalition governance and urging political leaders to adopt more inclusive, reconciliatory rhetoric. Beyond his media presence, he has contributed to academic research and mentoring at Unisa, helping researchers publish in accredited journals, which further underscores his dual role as both a scholar and a public intellectual.
