On successful completion participants will receive the Safety and Security Industry Management Development Programme (SSMDP) Certificate from the Unisa Graduate School of Business Leadership (SBL).

This Management Development Programme is a programme designed to provide the skills and knowledge to become future business leaders in the Safety and Security Industry sector.

REGISTRATION

The application and registration process for the SSMDP takes place from January 2019. Attendance at the SSMDP study schools are compulsory and the dates of these will be provided. Please note the Application Fee for 2019 is R160 and is in addition to the tuition fees.

ASSESSMENT

Assessments will be via various assignments and a portfolio examination for each module. Students will attend two study schools. The dates will be communicated to successful students.
